## Reports

Trustee Report – Ralph Sorochan
 National volunteer week April 14-20, thank you to everyone for caring for the students.

Provincial budget release Feb 29. Didn't receive funding until Mar 28. Didn't extend the deadline. Finance people are working diligently to get things done. School admin teams as well.

No funding rates have changed in the envelope or manual at all. Creates a much tighter budget as funding has not been increased to account for inflation. Government has increased funding for enrollment growth. Additional for individuals in schools.

Specialized learning (PUFF), grants have not increased (have remained the same). Classroom complexity deals with #s of students and individual needs in classrooms, mental health. Grant remains the same for classroom complexity. This is a priority for the board.

Mental health strategic plan remains a priority for the board. Will continue to support that plan, objectives and goals.

Infrastructure goals, has decreased by \$200,000. However there was an increase in the CMR (capital maintenance renewal) rates. For mechanical upgrades (ie boiler system upgrades, roof, etc). \$1.6M for mechanical upgrades. Aging infrastructure in the division, 41 schools, doesn't go very far, won't cover may additional projects.

Government restriction for 1.32%, increased to 6%, anything over that would have to go over the government.

New transportation funding model, most fees will decrease. K-6 students residing 1 km or less will be eligible, 7-12 2 km or less will be eligible. Eligible fee attending designated school will be \$75/year. Attending non-designated school will be \$75/year. Ineligible fee will be \$150 from \$225, ineligible for non-designated will be \$225. Kindergarten will be \$50, Kindergarten ineligible will be \$100.

Re-allocation of surplus funds -1.1M dollar overall surplus \$694 windows OS, \$325 chrome books, Sherwood park.

Financial projections are in the trustee report. Everything is looking fairly good there, where the surplus adjustment comes from.

Unaudited financial report received at the end of February, looks good there as well. Reports are located on the EIPS website under the trustee section.

Curriculum advocacy, social studies was recently released, request for the public and staff to provide feedback. Letter to the minister has been sent.

3 year capital plan has been approved. Fort Sask High has been approved. April 25 at 5:30 at Southpointe for information.

Fort Saskatchewan is growing and aging infrastructure is a problem.

May 2 and 30 are board meetings for EIPS.

Education week is coming up. Sponsored by the ATA and the Alberta Councils Association.
